#### Five Friends from Japan

Five Friends from Japan is the newest traveling exhibit visiting The Children's Museum of the Upstate. It is an interactive exhibit designed to entertain and educate the young and old by highlighting similarities and differences between Japan and the U.S. through vignettes of five Japanese children. Visitors will learn about school in Japan in The Classroom; visit Aisa's Kitchen and Tofu Shop; or stop by Yusuke's yard and practice aikido moves with the help of an instructor. Dress up in traditional lapanese attire in Sakiko's Bedroom, learn to write in Japanese in Ken's tatami room, and listen to different kinds of Japanese music in Shoko's living room.

This exhibition addresses a central question for the current generation: what happens to distinct cultures in an age of fluid exchanges of people, products, and information across national borders? Put differently, if all kids wear blue jeans, do they all think alike and have the same values? Children in the 21st Century will live
